pre-writing phase

- what is the aim of the manuscript?
- → objective/hypothesis
- → take home message
- is this something new?
- → familiar with literature
- → identify knowledge gap
- do I have supporting data/facts?
- → sound results
- → important results
- what is my story line?
- → general topic
- → preparation of key figures/tables



writing phase

- content/storyline
- → headers/subheaders
- → bullet points



- → "easiest" chapter
- → be specific
- → short sentences
- → avoid redundancies
- first draft
- → adjust intro/discussion/ storyline
- → improve language
- fine tuning
- → title, abstract
- co-authors
- → timeline
- → revisions



publishing phase

- journal selection
- → scope
- → impact
- submission
- → author instruction
- → format
- → cover letter
- reviewer comments
- → don't be offended
- → improvement
- → detailed rebuttal letter
- journal's decision
- → celebrate yay
- → not discouraged
